FROM MAJOR TREADWAY

The lengthening days of February will see the church shift from Ephipanytide to the sacred season of Lent. In the early days of my faith journey, Lent was not a season, but something to be removed from one's church clothes (preferably, prior to arriving at church for Sunday morning worship). Perhaps, you had a similar experience.



Over the years, I have come to see Lent as a journey, one that begins on Ash Wednesday (February 14, this year) and stretches all the way to Easter. The journey of Lent is marked in a variety of ways. The most noteworthy is as a fast. The fast, by church math, lasts forty days (Sundays don't count). It is intended to mirror the forty-day fast of Jesus in the wilderness prior to the beginning of his ministry. In the modern church, folks engaging in a Lenten fast, often choose something from which to fast (social media, chocolate, coffee, television, etc.).

The object of the fast is not what is ultimately important, rather, it is hoped that the regular acknowledgement of deprivation will call one's attention toward God. So when thinking about the season of Lent and participating in a fast, we would do well to consider what excesses in our daily lives, if we were to fast from them, would stimulate turning our attention to God as we journey together toward the cross.



HYMN HIGHLIGHT

As you know by now, I enjoy sharing the rich stories behind the hymns we sing. While the hymn texts often speak to us personally from our spiritual journeys, learning why a hymn was written can also touch our hearts deeply. Luther Bridgers, a promising, 26-year-old Methodist pastor, with a wife and three young sons was struck by tragedy. While visiting his wife's parents in Harrodsburg, KY, a fire engulfed the home during the night. A neighbor awoke, saw the flames, and attempted to awaken the family. Tragically Luther's wife and children perished in the fire. In the deep waters of sorrow Luther remembered that the Lord had promised never to leave or forsake him. It was during this period of heart-searching and grief that he wrote the hymn, *He Keeps Me Singing*, #597 in our *Celebrating Grace Hymnal.**

There's within my heart a melody; Jesus whispers sweet and low, "Fear not, I am with you, peace, be still," in all of life's ebb and flow.

Refrain: Jesus, Jesus, Jesus, sweetest name I know, fills my every longing, keeps me singing as I go.

All my life was wrecked by sin and strife, discord filled my heart with pain, Jesus swept across the broken strings, stirred the slumbering chords again. [Refrain]

Though sometimes He leads through waters deep, trials fall across the way; though sometimes the path seems rough and steep, see His footprints all the way. [Refrain]

Feasting on the riches of His grace, resting 'neath His sheltering wing, always looking on His smiling face, that is why I shout and sing. [Refrain]**

DEACONS' REPORT


