One of the great challenges of the season of Lent is holding fast to the Lenten journey when all around us people and businesses and even the weather seem to have skipped ahead to Easter. But this year, as in years past, I suspect that there is yet more for us on this journey.



We may long for the breaking of our fasting, and we may long to sing the songs of Easter praise, but there is a richness in holding onto our fasting, learning from our commitment to new practices, new wisdom and mercy in the telling of the stories of our faith one more time.

The first two Sundays of April, we will continue in the season of Lent, learning from the ostrich, the palms, and the stones. We will gather with the disciples in celebration of the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday. As the shadows gather on Good Friday, we will tell the story of Jesus's final day – his capture, trial, crucifixion, and burial.

HYMN HIGHLIGHT

He is not here: For He is risen, as He said. Come see the place where the Lord lay. Matthew 28:6

Charles Wesley wrote the originally titled "Hymn for Easter Day" for the first service in the new chapel (Foundry Meeting House) in London in 1739, one year after his dramatic conversion experience. He was inspired by Paul's gospel truth in 1 Corinthians 15. It summarizes both the experience and meaning of Christ's resurrection. The popularity of the hymn is due in part to the tune for which the composer has never been identified. "Hallelujah" or "alleluia" is from the ancient Hebrew worship service and was a common expression of praise in the early Christian church. Jerome, an important leader in the early church and translator of the Bible into Latin, wrote that in his day the very ceilings of houses of worship were often shaken with the reverberating "Hallelujahs" when believers sang their praises to God.

CHRIST THE LORD IS RISEN TODAY

Christ the Lord is risen today, Alleluia! Earth and heaven in chorus say, Alleluia! Raise your joys and triumphs high, Alleluia! Sing, ye heavens, and earth reply, Alleluia!

Love's redeeming work is done, Alleluia! Fought the fight, the battle won, Alleluia! Death in vain forbids Him rise, Alleluia! Christ has opened paradise, Alleluia!

Lives again our glorious King, Alleluia! Where, O death, is now thy sting? Alleluia! Dying once He all doth save, Alleluia! Where thy victory, O grave? Alleluia!

Soar we now where Christ has led, Alleluia! Following our exalted Head, Alleluia! Made like Him, like Him we rise, Alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, the skies, Alleluia!

We need egg fillers (candy and small prizes)! There will be bins in the foyer and at the covered entrance. Drop your donations off anytime between know and April 16th.






