FROM MAJOR TREADWAY

The month of May brings the end of Eastertide and the beginning of Ordinary Time. Nestled between these two seasons is Pentecost.



Pentecost is when we celebrate the gift of the Holy
Spirit and the birthday of the church. It is the annual
reminder to the church throughout the world that it is the Holy Spirit
that breathes life into the church and animates our faith.

And just like on that first Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit still has a reputation for being unpredictable. Church is that way, too. We never know who will step through the church doors or who we will encounter beyond the church property. We cannot always anticipate the opportunities we will have to be the Body of Christ, nor where we will have them. But we do know that the Holy Spirit accompanies us and empowers us. Beyond that, we are told, in Romans 8, that the Holy Spirit "helps us in our weakness," interceding on our behalf "with sighs too deep for words."

So as these East Tennessee Spring winds blow, be on the lookout. For it was with a sound like a loud rush of wind that Pentecost began in Acts 2. It just might be that the Holy Spirit is stirring. And you don't want to miss out on whatever the Holy Spirit might be up to.



AN AUDIENCE OF ONE—THOUGHTS ABOUT WORSHIP

A common misconception in churches today (and has been for a long time) is that the "up front people"—the worship leaders (including pastor, singers, choir, soloists, instrumentalists, Bible readers, etc.) are the performers of worship and the congregation is the audience. Many like to sit back in their seats, fold their arms, and say, "Entertain me. Bless me. Give me a great song and an inspiring sermon." —a common attitude for our entertainment-driven culture. They are sometimes called "pew potatoes."

One of the most profound illustrations that has helped me understand the various roles in worship comes from Søren Kierkegaard, a Danish philosopher, theologian, writer and psychologist, who said:

Worship isn't God's show. God is the audience. God's watching. The congregation, they are the actors in this drama. Worship is their show. And the minister is just reminding the people of their forgotten lines.

Many people view the roles of worship like this:

- The worship leaders are the *performers* of worship. They sing the great songs, preach the powerful sermons, and perform instrumental solos with great precision.
- The congregation is the *audience*. They sit back and take in the great show.
- God is the *prompter* of worship, i.e. He tells the worship leaders what to do—what songs to choose, what passage of scripture to read, etc.

Kierkegaard stated that in corporate worship:

- The people should be the *performers* of worship. They are actively participating in the act of worship.
- The worship leaders are the *prompters* of worship. They lead the congregation on a journey of worship, helping them to voice their praise to God.
- God is the audience. He is receiving our offering of worship.

If congregations fully understand that worship is not something done for them, but they are active participants in the journey, it can truly transform worship in our churches. We worship the Audience of One.


